

## How America Became a Right-Wing Nation: Lessons from the 1970s

The decade of the 1970s represented a turning point in US politics, which shifted in a rightward direction toward free market economics at the domestic level; combined with more militaristic and interventionist policies overseas. The course explores the origins of this political shift, with a special emphasis on the role of elite business interests in orchestrating the project. The course will also assess how the rightward shift in US domestic politics helped generate the globalization of the economy and the off-shoring of US jobs. I argue that many of the sources of political conflicts in twenty first century America -- including conflicts over stagnant living standards, overseas military intervention, free trade, and cultural/social issues -- had their origins in the 1970s.
