## Architecture: the Idea of Materials, the Material of Ideas Álvaro Malo, Professor Emeritus

This seminar aims to elicit attendants' participation in a free-spirited conversation and regain a sense of wonder and intimacy with architecture. The discussion topics will be based on five readings, which are accessible, practical, and poetic. They will offer a generous survey of philosophical and architectural thinking from classical to modern—time is relative—examining the motives and reasons for the making of architecture and the concurrent material consciousness.

- 1. Feb. 22 Aristotle for Everybody: difficult thought made easy \*, by Mortimer Adler reading focus on "Man the Maker," more specifically on "The Four Causes": material, efficient, formal, final. (p. 39-48)
- 2. Mar. 1 Dialogues, by Paul Valéry reading focus on "Eupalinos, or The Architect," a speculative modern version of a classical Socratic dialogue. (p. 65-150)
- 3. Mar. 8 The Craftsman, by Richard Sennett reading focus on "Material Consciousness," a humanistic and philosophical modern view of craftsmanship. (p. 119-146)
