## **Anatomy of the Science Fiction Short Story**

The short story is a highly disciplined literary form with tightly controlled structural and plot requirements. The science fiction version of this art form must satisfy these requirements and introduce a new scientific or technological advance which functions as an integral part of the plot. In this seminar we will read a series of short stories and discuss them in class. We will develop an appreciation of the short story as an art form, examining the function of dialogue, action, point of view, rolling exposition, infodumps, entry points, and the sense of an ending.
